- II. Approve Minutes

Jim McKenna: We were light in operations, but we recently solved that with Mary Gallagher's new position (Operations & Service Coordinator.) Also, when you have multiple boards to report to, it needs to be multiple people doing the reporting, so sometimes it's Jasen Lawrence or Kim Rielly going to the Board of Supervisors instead of me.

Comments on this handout?

 Jim McKenna: The Franklin County contract parallels Essex County contract; as occupancy tax grows, the budget grows.

- Mike Beglin: Let the record reflect that Jecinda has received onboarding documents.
 - Mike Beglin reaffirmed everyone on the board also has this onboarding information, and can get it if they need it again.

III. Accept Financials - Charlie Cowan & John Huttlinger

John Huttlinger: We are getting a financial statement format, and broken out by regions. There are two statements that Karen Meister prepares. The Chamber packet she provided has two statement of activity reports. We took approved budget and spread the data on a monthly basis to best of our knowledge. We can address changes or concerns a little more readily. We are trying to decide on how to design the report, a large spreadsheet might be too much for meetings such as this. There are a couple of items that we need to look at, but overall the reports are good.

Cristina Lussi: To make it clear, because we have Lake Placid Chamber of Commerce, Inc., we need to have a header here. (Indicating on subsequent pages of report.) When you start to separate the pages out, it gets very confusing.

John Huttlinger: Karen runs these off Quickbooks, which is fine, we're going to manipulate the layout a little
more. Downloading to an Excel spreadsheet may work and give us that flexibility we need. I'll work with her
on that.

John Huttlinger: Looking at the Statement of Financial Position. Jim and I spoke about cash flow a bit and analysis.

- Jim McKenna: Concerned about cash flow and would like to look at on a more regular basis.
- John Huttlinger: There will be some minor changes based on the audit, but nothing major.

John Huttlinger: Regarding the LPECQD report produced off of Quickbooks. There is a lot of activity surrounding the time for Empire State Winter Games. Nothing out of sorts here. This report includes salaries and wages now.

- Cris Lussi: Where did the sponsorship of MarketNY end up?
- Jim McKenna: That won't show up yet, you have to spend it and then get reimbursed.
- · Cris Lussi: But that should be somewhere, right? As a receivable?
- · Mike Beglin: You're right, it should be.
- · Jim McKenna: It'll be at least a month.
- John Huttlinger: We can put that number in.
- Jim McKenna: The grant amount needs to be matched, and we have done that with new money. It's basically registrations and sponsorships. Biggest sponsor was Community Bank this year, and we have a vocal commitment from them for next year. And a number of other sponsorships that we had this year. What we've got now is the ability to take these Games to the next level next year.
- Ed Finnerty: With the 501c3, that second checking account, is that money left over from the Mara Smith?
- Jim McKenna: Yes. We acted as the 501c3 for her, and that money is still present.

John Huttlinger: Audit was completed in December, however the reports were delayed due to an employee illness. Planning on starting 2015 audit as soon as possible.

IV. CEO Report & Departmental Updates - Jim McKenna

Empire State Winter Games

- When we started with the Empire State Winter Games, we wanted to grow the events, expanded the Games around the region, and rebrand them.
- · Cris Lussi: Do we copyright those new logos?
 - · Jim McKenna: Not yet, but we need to.
- · Viewing of Empire State Winter Games video.
- · Now that we have the skilled videographer this is easy to turn around in house
- Tait Wardlaw has been instrumental in putting on the new events and the rebranding.
- The plan for next year is to redress all the venues in the new branding.
- Titus Mountain leant a snow maker to Pisgah, and ORDA leant a CAT to PIsgah, these organizations were all working together to make sure the Games worked.
- We would like to add additional day for future years, possibly starting on Thursday.
- · Chris Ericson: I love the direction this is going in. You need to revisit opening ceremony though.
 - Jim McKenna: We agree, and we want to up the ceremony and the spectator base.

Miscellaneous

- · Airbnb will now collect occupancy tax where applicable and filter it to counties. We will be looking into this.
- We have started talking to Malone, to hopefully come up with an agreement similar to those we have in Tupper Lake and Saranac Lake.
- Hamilton County is doing program with Adirondack Trail Towns, setting up itineraries throughout the Adirondacks.
 - They have requested that we take \$60,000 of their grant and hire an employee to implement the program.
 - This person would work in our Tupper Lake office (centrally located to the program region.)
 - · We would also provide some in-kind services.
 - Potential for self funded component in the long run.
 - · Need board approval.
 - Motion to proceed. Moved by Melinda Little. Seconded by Jill Cardinale.
 - · Any questions? No.
 - · All in favor

IRONMAN 70.3

- Jim McKenna: I have spoken to everyone who has direct involvement with the current IRONMAN race. Everyone is supportive of there possibly being an additional 70.3 race. The race has economic impact and weather proof. It also solidifies more training appeal here and would bring Lake Placid to another realm. A 70.3 race has more growth potential than a full race. Locally, this is 8 a.m. 4 p.m. instead of 7 p.m. midnight, which means less road closure. The host fee of \$100,000 (full is currently \$85,000) For volunteers we will look to colleges and high schools which will be in session.
- Cris Lussi: For those directly affected, such as golf and fishing, what are you going to do to help them not feel the pain of losing that business? They're losing hotel business.
 - Jim McKenna: I don't think there's anything we can do except help them figure out how they grow their
 markets too. Craig Wood Golf Course has an annual event that weekend, but the Supervisor is very willing
 to help make it work. Maybe we adjust the one way traffic, but there are ways to deal with these issues.
 Also, there is a smaller footprint with the road closures. It can be figured out.
- Ed Finnerty: With the contract, how many rooms do we need to contribute for their staff?

- · Jim McKenna: About fifteen.
- The total cost will probably be around \$120,000 \$125,000.
- Motion to authorize Jim McKenna to pursue the IRONMAN 70.3. Moved by Ed Finnerty. Seconded by Chris Ericson. All in favor.

In the February 15, 2012 meeting One of the major issues with the Empire State games. The need to keep them going and build on them was a topic.

I believe that year we had 850 participants and \$40,000 budget

The next year was roughly 1,100 participants and \$81,000

This year we anticipate 1,800 and over \$250,000 budget in addition to that we have secured a \$30,000 sponsor.

Create a better relationship and work closer with ORDA. Since then we have solidified our relationship in the conference center and look forward to our most especially her over. We are also working closer with them on events.

During our retreat of 2013 we had long-term goals. Amongst them one of the major ones was to find a mix of different sources of funding not just Essex county occupancy tax. (We have created contracts with Saranac Lake Franklin county Hamilton County and possibly Malone.)

ROOST should look to be more help as a middleman helping Yost get put together (we now have a 1% loan fund for hotel improvements being used in Speculator)

ROOST should help with regard to destination management and packaging, bundling make it easier to put together trips. (we have contracted with and Inntopia)

We should expand and promote the Adirondacks more than just Essex County. (we now have a contract with Franklin County Hamilton County Tupper Lake and Saranac Lake)

Do more for smaller and more independent operations like bed-and-breakfast a reservation system to help them (Inntopia)

Pursue expansion of of bed tax for vacation private rentals (this was accomplished and put into action in October)

Improve how ROOST is perceived by surrounding area (the recent letter from Clyde in last weeks newspaper says it all.)

In our meeting of August 2014 we wanted to rework and revise the bylaws of the 501(c)(3) to be sure to meet or regulations. (done)

Also a major goal was to expand empire state games into other venues and regions. We also wanted to make it a weeklong event as soon as possible. (As you are aware we have expanded into Franklin County.)

In our meeting of November 14,2014 we talked about staff changes and restructuring since then (We subcontracted on finances with Meister accounting and brought in a CFO in 2015).

We brought all webwork in house.

We set up our own servers and coders in house (now things that would take a week or more are done in hours)

Our end of your retreat and 2014 early 15 one of the major topics was reorganizing and optimizing staff roles and transfer from crisis management to goal orientation with structured management roles. The other major topic was succession for Jim

(Since then the office has been totally rearranged with vertical management. Now everybody knows who to answer to and what their main expertise is. The most recent action was the higher of Glenn Pareira and a CFO.) (See graph of management organization.)


(Work is in progress and forward motion has taken place with respect to the secession of Jim.).

At that same meeting Cristina Lussi and the board said they're needed to be more transparency of the board. (We now have ROOST ADK which was established for more transparency.)

During the June meeting of 2015 Jill, Charlie and the board asked to have better information with regard to our contracts with the different counties and towns in order to understand where the moneys going and if it makes sense. (The spreadsheet presented today goes a long way to answering that question.)


As an aside the biggest goal since I've been on the board was to increase our budget. We had reach a ceiling for the most part of funding through the occupancy tax revenues of Lake Placid. For years were always under 2 million we are now well over 4 million

Hamilton County Regional Report - February 2016 Laura O'Brien

Indian Lake

- Yes, the lack of snow is affecting the businesses here. And we had to cancel the fishing derby, which would bring in over 200 fishermen. All of the times that I have been in Indian Lake Restaurant they have been busy, but I haven't had to chance to actually ask how business is.
- We will be having our Winterfest/SNOCADE event Feb. 12 20, and hopefully we will see some of our second homeowners around.
- Unfortunately, we have lost a lodging business. The Lone Birch Motel has closed and is for sale. Maybe someone will see the hole and fill the void. It is never good to lose beds within the community.

In Hamilton County, the following received awards:

- ANCA \$750,000 for an innovative financing tool for energy efficiency and renewable energy projects.
- Adirondack Museum \$63,000 for fabrication of its new exhibition the Adirondack Experience, which will open in May 2017.
- Town of Indian Lake \$200,000 for main street revitalization.
- DRAG of Speculator \$120,000 for grooming equipment for snowmobile trails.
- Indian Lake Theater \$23,400 for part time tech and maintenance person.
- Great Camp Sagamore \$251,950 for two projects: \$48,450 for upgrades to its Interpretive and Visitor Center; and \$203,500 for improvements to the Chalet building.
- Speculator Development \$2.5M for Lake Pleasant Lodge expansion project.

Inlet:

- I am very happy to say that we had a much needed successful Adirondack Ice Bowl last weekend. The ice conditions were perfect for the 44 teams to play on the 4 rinks that were set up on Fourth Lake in front of The Woods Inn. Accommodations were full in both Inlet and Old Forge. Thousand of spectators on Saturday made everyone in the area happy. And then the very next day, the weather warmed up, the snow all melted and the lakes formed puddles on top of them. Snowmobile trail groomers were out on Sunday (Jan 31) smoothing things over, but have not been out since. This weekend the accommodations had many cancelations. And zero snowmobile permits were sold by Town of Webb/Inlet on Friday, February 5, which must be a record. The crosscountry ski trails have also not been groomed since Sunday. They are icy with bare spots, and our ice skating rink had to be closed.
- It is snowing as I type this, and maybe a couple inches will bring some people back next weekend, but we really need a good 5-6 inches to be back in business.
- We have 3 weeks to get ready for our Frozen Fire & Lights on February 27. Hoping to have enough snow for the cardboard sled race and the youth snowmobile races planned. And for people to enjoy the cross-country ski trails at Fern Park. Everything else can happen without the snow. Full schedule is at www.frozenfireandlights.com.
- We were hoping to add snowmobile drag races to our February calendar on Chip & Cindy Sauer's track behind The Ole Barn (the same track that was used for the Shootout), and even had a date set for the 20th. Unfortunately this event is not going to take place this year, but we are planning to have one or two such races in place for next year.
- We do have vintage snowmobile races planned for the weekend of Old Forge's Snofest March 11-13. These will be on an oval track on the ice near the Fourth Lake Boat Launch. They have not

confirmed which day yet, but hope to know soon. There may be youth races during this event as well.

- We also have "Let's Get Crocked! and have some soup!" on the calendar for March 12 at noon. For this event we are asking people to bring in a crock pot full of their favorite soup to share and be judged by the people. A suggestion donation/entry fee of \$10 will be given to the local food pantry. A donation cup will also be set up for anyone else wishing to give.
- Our snowmobile season does not end until April 1st, but some of our winter businesses shut down after St. Patrick's Day. And the school's spring break is very early this year starts March 19. Our schools get two weeks off for spring break they do not take a winter break. So unfortunately, even if we still have snow the end of March, many locals will be out of town (myself included) because of this school break. This does not help extend our winter season.
- Looking ahead towards spring I have started a t-shirt design contest for this year's Community Pride Day shirts open to all ninth grade students attending school in Town of Webb, Indian Lake, Long Lake & Lake Pleasant. Details about the contest can be found at www.inletny.com. Community Pride Day is the day the towns all get together to clean up the streets and get ready for a prosperous summer.
