

Adirondack Mountains - Brews & Views

The Adirondack Mountains in upstate New York offer more than 2,000 miles of trails that wind along forested paths, leading to roaring waterfalls, stunning lakes, and summits with views that extend as far as the eye can see. Hiking is one of the best, easiest and most popular ways to enjoy the area, quenching visitors' thirst for adventure. The best part - local breweries often complement each view - in many locations, visitors can easily visit a brewery to take in local culture and sample delicious microbrews.

- Day at Ausable Chasm, then head to Ausable Brewing Co. (Keeseville)
- Hike Coon Mt., then head to Ledge Hill Brewing Co. (Westport)
- Hike Severence Mt, then head to Paradox Brewery (North Hudson/Schroon)
- Hike Mt. Arab Firetower, then head to Raquette River Brewing (Tupper Lake)
- Hike Henry's Woods, then head to Big Slide Brewery (Lake Placid)
- Relax at Moose Pond, then head to Hex and Hop Brewing (Bloomingdale)
- Hike McKenzie Mountain, then head to Ray Brook Brewhouse (near Saranac Lake)

Visit Adirondack Wayfinder for the local brewery options.

Not a beer drinker? No problem, there are plenty of other combos to choose from. One favorite of many hikers is bringing some freshly brewed coffee and a homemade pastry from a local coffee shop along for the adventure. In the summertime, many choose to cap off their adventures with a stop at one of the many local ice cream stands, sure to induce feelings of nostalgia.
