Adirondacks, USA

The Adirondack region offers some of the best opportunities for outdoor recreation in a beautiful, natural setting. The Adirondacks have been a beloved vacation destination for generations of visitors; a place where the wilderness provides countless opportunities for adventure, exploration, and fun.

The word "vacation" came into existence when the Adirondack region became a popular destination in the early 1800s, as wealthy people would "vacate" the stifling heat of the city and travel to the Adirondacks, where the air was cool and clear.

Today, whether it's for a day, a long weekend, or a whole season, the Adirondack region continues to provide a perfect vacation getaway filled with small towns and big outdoors. A natural wonderland of fresh air, pristine water, and breathtaking landscapes give visitors an opportunity to relax, visit legendary places, reconnect with the natural world, and discover all that the area has to share.



Size and Population

- At over 6 million acres, the Adirondack Park is bigger than five national parks combined: Grand Canyon, Great Smoky, Yellowstone, Yosemite, and Glacier.
- The Adirondack Park is the largest protected area in the contiguous United States, delineated by a "blue line" on maps of New York state.
- Unlike other parks, there are no entrance gates or fees. You're free to come and go as you please.
- Only about 137,000 people live in the Adirondacks full time (an average of 14 people / sq mile).
- Hamilton County, the third-largest geographically, is the least populated county in the state, and does not have a single traffic light, offering plenty of wilderness to explore and enjoy.

Fun History

- The first hotel in the world to have electricity in every room was located on the shores of Blue Mountain Lake. You can learn more at the Adirondack Experience, the Museum on Blue Mountain Lake.
- Theodore Roosevelt was on vacation hiking in the High Peaks when he learned President McKinley, who had suffered from a gunshot wound, might not recover. Roosevelt became president in the middle of the night while traveling to the train station in North Creek.
- In 1892, the state legislature created a law that public lands within the Adirondacks are to remain "forever wild," ensuring that future generations will enjoy this amazing natural landscape.
- The Adirondacks have long been known as a place of healing. Starting in the late 1800's, Saranac Lake was a world-famous center for tuberculosis treatment and research.

Geography

- The mountains are getting taller every year! Because of geologic uplift, the Adirondacks continue to rise about 2mm annually.
- Put end to end, the length of all rivers, brooks, and streams would go all the way around the Earth, with plenty left over.
- More than 3,000 lakes and ponds of all shapes and sizes offer fun year-round, from summer swimming, picnicking, and boating, to the lure of winter ice fishing.
- The Adirondacks contain more than 1,500 miles of designated hiking trails, from the challenging High Peaks to serene strolls through the woods.
- Essex County contains the most waterfalls in the state, with 47 in the county.

Travel

- Ready for adventure? In the Adirondacks, there are many incredible opportunities for hiking, skiing (alpine and crosscountry), boating, fishing, camping, hunting, golf, cycling, skating, birding, and more.
- The Adirondacks welcome more than 7 million visitors each year, more than the Grand Canyon, but with 6 million acres, there is plenty of room for you to stretch your legs.
- The region offers over 11,000 rental rooms in hotels, motels, inns, cabins, and cottages, along with almost 12,000 campsites. Love s'mores? This is your destination.
- With a mix of private and public lands, you'll find some of the best scenery is free and open to the public, ideal for selfies and making unforgettable memories.
- Bring the kids! We have numerous destinations, activities, and adventures that are super family-friendly, from awardwinning nature centers to sandy beaches with mountain views.
