

Adirondack Mountains - Beach vs mountain vacation destination

The region's high peaks offer exceptional hiking challenges while some of the lower-elevation mountains allow those who are new to the sport the opportunity to develop and enhance their mountain skills. Many of the lower-elevation hikes are nestled among the high peaks, making for spectacular views with much less effort.

In all cases, one of the most beautiful things about the region is the proximity of the lakes to the mountains. In fact, they are as close as can be imagined. Many mountains have lakes along the trail to the summit, with rivers and streams also flowing along the trail. Many lakes in the Adirondacks are ringed by mountains that appear to rise right out of the water. As people sunbathe on an Adirondack beach, they are also soaking in the spectacular mountain views. As people hike the mountains, they discover mountain lakes along their journey.
